Answer these questions

1. What happens after the baby windhover hears the sound?

A beak bursts through the egg shell and after more chipping, a tiny and pale head of a windhover chick comes out of it.

2. Who takes the baby windhover away?

A boy bundles the windhover chick in a sack and takes it away.

3. 'I throw myself against the bars and fall'

Where is the baby windhover?

The baby windhover is inside a cage.

4. Why does the baby windhover become so thin and weak?

The bird becomes so thin and weak because it cannot eat the food when the boy gives. The boy does not crush the food into smaller pieces.

5. “A wild bird can’t be yours”

Who is the speaker? What does she explain to the boy?

The speaker is a little girl who visits the baby birds every day. She explains to the boy that wild creatures should not be caged. So she tells the boy to release the bird, or else it would die.

6. How does the baby windhover know it is safe?

The baby windhover knows it is safe because it is back in its nest with mother and other chicks.
